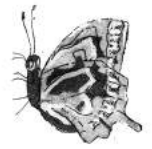




Grow MAKE Eat



How our 'Grow-Make-Eat!' Programme works...

We believe passionately in fostering strong relationships with schools in order to lend expertise and time in the common goal of using food education to enrich daily lives. By dedicating time to the development of the school garden and kitchen we aim to give your school the foundations to make food education part of the daily curriculum. A resource that not only allows us to run our after school clubs and or curriculum sessions but provides an invaluable, productive resource long after we are gone.



Our relationship...



We will draw up a list of equipment needed and source plants and seeds that will allow the clubs and sessions to run effectively for as many children as you feel would benefit. We can work alongside you to raise funds to pay for this equipment if necessary. For example working with students to create a 'Grow-Make-Eat!' Market or pop-up restaurant where funds can go towards the project.

Managing the Garden- How We Can Help...

The Grow Make Eat team will coordinate the upkeep of the growing spaces within the school. This will involve working with the school to create a class timetable for watering and tending. As the garden develops we will enlist the help of parent volunteers with the support of the school. This team of volunteers will be tasked to maintain the garden through the holiday periods.



What we need from you...



The school is asked to provide a fund for plants, seeds, compost and tools when necessary. These can be sourced by our team. With guidance from our team, the school is asked to develop (if necessary) and maintain both the kitchen and garden to a standard that allows the club and curriculum sessions to run effectively.





What we offer

After School Clubs

An after school session includes both gardening in the school garden and cooking in the kitchen. The children either take home what they made or eat it together in the garden.

Maximum of 16 students lead by one or two trained team members depending on numbers.

Time: 1.5 - 2hr session

Price: Fees in line with the school's after school pricing structure (between £15-£20 per session per child.) Price includes one hour of garden and kitchen prep by our staff before and after the club plus ingredients, seeds and plants.



One-off Curriculum Workshops

Whole day workshops to include growing and cooking within the session. Covers new D&T and Science objectives, as well as objectives for outdoor learning. Can be tailored for any age group. Maximum of 30 students lead by one trained team member supported by two members of staff provided by the school.

Time: 1 day

Price: Flexible pricing structures depending on requirements, £250 per session.



Weekly Workshop Programmes

A chance to get the whole school involved in the making of a pop-up school allotment using grow bags and pallets. A Grow-Make-Eat leader to come into school once a week for half a term to lead workshops ranging from 1 - 2hrs with different classes depending on requirements. Includes growing and cooking within each session. Maximum of 30 students lead by one trained team member supported by two members of staff provided by the school.

Time: Weekly 1 - 2hr sessions during school day.

Price: Prices dependent on amount of classes booked.
